

Visit to Gandhi Ashram (4'Th and 5'Th October)

Students and Faculties of Department of Computer Science, Gujarat University visited Gandhi ashram on 4'th and 5'th October 2019. The Indian independence movement developed strong roots in Ahmedabad when Mahatma Gandhi established the Satyagraha Ashram on the banks of the Sabarmati River in 1917. The ashram became the center of intense nationalist activities launched by the Mahatma. It was from here that he launched the famous Dandi March in protest of the British Salt Law. The ashram remained his home until 1930 and later came to be known as Sabarmati Ashram. His living quarters are preserved as a small museum and there is a pictorial record of the major events in his life. This was experienced by students who interestingly obtained information about Gandhi's life and times in the city.

A total of 70 Students from MCA, M.Sc, PGDCA and M.Tech visited the Ashram. They were accompanied by 8 professors from the department. They spent around one and a half hour to understand the values and methodologies proposed by Gandhi Babu.
