#### Introduction of the Course

In philosophy, we think deeply on the question of the existence of the world and the soul, the existence of their creator God, the question of the fruits of action, the questions of the cause of sorrow and many such questions related to life. After deliberation, truth is interviewed through the उत्तर पक्ष and पूर्व पक्ष process.
